Meeting with Aizawl DC for Beggars Welfare



MFM team met with Aizawl DC Er. Lalhriatpuia on 17th March to discuss the implementation of "SMILE - Support for Marginalized Individuals for Livelihood and Enterprise" at Aizawl. The project aims to make 'Bhiksha-Vritti Mukt Bharat' (begging-free) and make a strategy for comprehensive rehabilitation of persons engaged in begging through coordinated action of various stakeholders such as Central and State Governments, local bodies, NGOs working in the field, social activists and public at large. The approach of this Scheme is to provide the whole range of services including awareness generation for people involved simultaneously in substance abuse and begging, identification, rehabilitation, provision of medical facilities, counselling, education, skill development and sustainable settlement of persons engaged in begging through State Governments/UTs, Local Urban bodies, voluntary and other organizations.

Initiatives under 'Prevention of Drug Abuse Among Youth in Mizoram' during March



MFM team Operation Kingdom Ministry Home in Phunchawng and organized a focus group discussion on a topic of "How I Will Spend My Life After Being Discharged From the Rehabilitation Center to Prevent Relapse." A total of fifty (50) clients participated in this activity, with ages ranging from 16 to 63 years. All participants are recovering alcohol abusers who actively engaged in the discussion.

It was observed during this session that clients expressed a need for strong support from their families after their discharge from the rehabilitation home; they also indicated that participation in church activities could greatly contribute to relapse prevention. Most importantly, they stressed that taking personal responsibility is essential for maintaining sobriety, and they highlighted that faith in God is vital for overcoming addiction. Furthermore, obtaining employment is critical for avoiding relapse.

The team also visited Special Home in Durtlang, which accommodates children under the age of eighteen (18). During their stay at the Home, they receive education, counseling and skills development training. Currently, there are twenty-four (24) children residing there, with a total capacity of fifty (50). Staff members indicated that due to financial difficulties, the skills development training cannot be conducted effectively. As a result, the Special Home staffs asked the MFM organisation to provide training for their children so that they can lead normal lives after leaving restoration. In Mizoram, there are only two Special Homes, located in Lunglei and Aizawl.

JSS MAMIT activity report





JSS Mamit set a target of 1,800 enrollments for the financial year 2024-25. This target was successfully achieved in March after extensive mobilization efforts and active enrollment camps conducted by the team across various villages.

As of today, 751 candidates have already been assessed, while assessments for the remaining candidates are ongoing across 15 sub-training centers. Jan Shikshan Sansthan Mamit has been selected as a Model JSS. Under the Skills Acquisition and Knowledge Awareness for Livelihood Promotion (SANKALP) initiative, a training lab has been installed to enhance the quality of training. A total of 38 machines have been installed, including: 30 industrial sewing machines, 3 embroidery machines, 2 multipurpose zigzag machines, 2 overlock machines and 1 Display Screen. These machines are being utilized for the Assistant Dress Maker training program. An inspection of the newly installed lab was conducted on 27th March 2025 by Miss Ellen Lalnunmawii from the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) team.
